Conclusion of the Open Innovation Toolkit for Sustainability focused intra-preneurship

The purpose of SINTRA Toolkit is to introduce a set of tools that can be used for assessing the entrepreneurial orientations of intrapreneurs and their readiness to collect ideas in a business/organisation for sustainability purposes. These tools can help approach innovation more systematically, keep track of progress and find new approaches to sustainability, both in an environmental, social and economic context.

The Toolkit is comprised of:

- i. A Handbook for organisational/business model's sustainability assessment
- ii. Guidelines for involving talents to open innovation projects in cooperation with intrapreneurs
- iii. A Toolkit for assessment of intrapreneurs' readiness to collect ideas by using open innovation tools
